
Wombats Take Flight Over Avalanche!

The Walla Walla Wombats put together a TML best 24-6 record this month, passing and taking a 3-game lead over Albany (17-13 for the month) in the Steinmetz Division. The Wombats batted .308 as a team (.502 SLG) for the month, while finishing 2nd in pitching at 3.47. Starter Kyle Hendricks was 6-0 and closer Alex Colome had 10 Saves.

Elsewhere in the Oceanic Conference, Arkansas (22-8) made up 5 games and caught Perth (17-13) in the Ruth Division. The Wild Card will likely come from either the Steinmetz or Ruth, as no team in the Williams is above .500. Despite losing 12 of their last 15 games, Williams leader Oklahoma (.482) is still in front of Lake Wobegone by 4 games!

Over in the Atmospheric Conference, Duluth (20-10) caught and passed Vanderlyle (13-17) in the Robinson Division, now with a 4-game lead. Glenmont is only 6 games behind and Madison is only 7 out. Beverly (19-11) caught and passed Valparaiso (12-18) in the Gatto, now with a 4-game lead. In the Gehrig, Toxic Waste (19-11) is pulling away from the pack, extending their lead to 7 games over Burleigh. The fight for the Atmos Wild Card should come down to the bitter end!

Toxic Waste's "Player of the Month" Daniel Murphy, who had a hellacious month, and is the new batting leader at a lofty .404, well ahead of Perth's D.J. LeMahieu at .362. Both Traffic's Nick Markakis and Mudville's Wilson Ramos are hitting a little over .350. Murphy also leads the TML in SLG (.794), OBP (.434), Hits (90), Runs (47), RBI (55), HR (20), 2B (25) and EXBH (46)! Albany's Billy Hamilton is the SB leader with 18 SB.

The new ERA leader is Toxic Waste's Drew Pomeranz (1.97), followed by Beverly's "Pitcher of the Month" Michael Fulmer at 2.13. Perth's Marco Estrada is right there at 2.14. Mudville's Matt Boyd is 8-0, followed by two other 8-game winners, Pomeranz (8-1) and Walla Walla's Kyle Hendricks (8-

2). There are also six 7-game winners, including **Estrada** at 7-0. The strikeout leader is **Madison's Max Scherzer** with 107 K. **Albany's Koji Uehara** (3.00, 15-18 SVO) and **Arkansas' Tyler Thornburg** (2.55, 15-19 SVO) are the SAVES co-leaders.
