# Supercells Finally Show Up on Radar!

The Oklahoma Supercells went 12-4 in the final month to pull away from Lake Wobegone and take the Williams Division Crown by 8 games! Walla Walla had the best month of all TML teams, going 14-2, locking up the Steinmetz Division and securing best record in the Oceanic Conference at 111-49. In the Ruth, Perth and Arkansas paced each other (11-5) and ended up tied for first. Perth was awarded the division crown on a 10-6 advantage over Arkansas.

Over in the Atmospheric Conference, two-time defending TML Champs Toxic Waste (11-5 in October) clinched the Gehrig Division and best record in the Conference. Duluth easily clinched the Robinson Division, as did Beverly in the Gatto. Burleigh, despite an 8-8 record in October, beat out Vanderlyle by 3 games for the Conference Wild Card.

Despite Toxic Waste's Daniel Murphy batting .403 in the final month, Madison's Jose Altuve won the batting title .367 to Murphy's .363. Murphy ended up the leader in SLG (.656), RBI (132), 2B (53), EXBH (97), OPS (1.051) and RC (161). Altuve led the TML in Hits (258) and Runs (137). Albany's Mike Trout was the leader in OBP (.436) and Walks (119). Arkansas' Brian Dozier emerged as the HR champ with 47 HR, followed by New York's Khris Davis (45), Amsterdam's Edwin Encarnacion (43) and Burleigh's Matt Kemp (42). Albany's Billy Hamilton was the SB leader with 62 SB in 78 attempts.

The ERA leader was Lake Wobegone's Clayton Kershaw holding nearly steady at 1.92. Beverly's Michael Fulmer was a distant second at 2.45. Kershaw led

the TML in CG (8). Walla Walla's Kyle Hendricks was the leader in victories at 24-4, followed by Oklahoma's Justin Verlander at 20-9. They were the only two 20-game winners this season! The strikeout leader was Madison's Max Scherzer (312 K), well ahead of Verlander (272). The "Fireman of the Year" was Arkansas' Tyler Thornburg (40/46 SVO, 43 RP, 2.07).
