The Major Ceague

"A History"

As the Firesign Theater was quoted, "It all comes back to me like a hot kiss on the end of a wet fist." Certainly, the time is ripe to delve into the gory details of the founding of the TML.

1978

In April of 1978, Mike Landin and I had just really met Larry Alber and in the course of one of our discussions, mentioned the possibility of getting together a full scale draft League. None of us really had the time to spend on such a project, as we were all bound up in other Leagues, both as Managers and Organizers.

As we got closer to Summer, I had an idea that the season to start with would be 1975. You could grab Fred Lynn and Jim Rice as rookies and really go to town: I went as far as to break down the entire card set into positions, in order to use Nite Mahan's proven B.I.G. (Baseball Is Great) system in the intial drafting of teams. I mentioned the 1975 idea casually to Dallas Adams in a letter and while he thought it was an interesting idea, the "Hindsight is Golden" theory would rule in trades and rookie drafts. Hence, Dallas was opposed to it. Now, you must realize that I value Dallas' opinions very highly.

In November of '78, the G.T.O. (Great Teams Organization), that Mike and I were running, had its first Championship Series, at my apartment. Present were future TML Managers Lentine & Lentine, Siciliano, Mayko, Zuchowski, Alber, Landin, and Pertierra. The impetus to start the TML basically came out of that get-together. The idea was presented gently and there did not seem to be much argument with starting a draft REPLAY League, even among these hard core APBA-ites.

If we have to pick a key period for the fruition of the TML, it has to be the Winter of 1978-79. Larry and I got together in late December for his annual thrashing of me in Bob Moore's Replay Money League (RML). After the games had mercifully ended for me, we spent a couple of hours getting our ideas down on paper, in regards to what we wanted to see in our yet un-named venture. A few days after that, Mike and I spent a good 1 to 2 hours on the phone convincing ourselves to invest in a computer terminal/printer. Mike and I left it at: we'll get it and try it out in the G.T.O. for our second season. If it worked out in the G.T.O., which had a 12 team format, then it would be an excellent test for the "new League."

1979

As the January winds began to howl, Larry, Mike, and I sat down in Mike's den and really started to get about the business of firming and solidifying the "new League." We agreed to a basic Constitution. We also felt that it should be written as a joint venture. We also felt that the people who were selected for Managership in the League should get a view of the Constitution in its preliminary stages, so as to give them a chance for direct input towards its final draft. We wanted to get the message across in the Constitution that this was going to be a fun League, without a lot of rules, but the rules that were there, were going to be enforced. The three of us had been in countless Leagues in which their concepts stretched across the entire spectrum of rules and format. We hoped that the end product of our work would take in the best ideas from each in hopes of expanding them and eliminating many of the problems we had run into as Managers. The one idea that we all agreed on from the very beginning was the idea of rewarding the Manager who was timely. We thought that with the extra incentive of dinero, the stats and newsletter would be as current upon receipt of the newsletter, as when they were mailed out.

I told Mike and Larry that I was getting sick of referring to this entire thing as the "new League" and thought that it was about time we named the baby. We came up with many ideas, but settled on the present moniker. It got the idea across without sounding too pompous and the initials "TML" were all right for a nickname.

That night, we also decided that the TML would be a forty team League. I'm sure we all blanched privately when this came up, but the more we talked about it, the better it sounded. The major concern over going with 40 teams was the load it would drop on Mike as the stat man and whether there were actually 40 crazies out there who would like to fly with us on our starship. We drew up a tentative list of names to invite along for the trip. When we reached the number 100, we stopped. Larry said that we could probably expect a 50% response and it would fill us up. Remembering the initial setting up of the G.T.O. and the amount of "begging" I had to do to fill out the Managerial roster for just 8 teams, I was speculative. I underestimated the name of Larry Alber. All of the big guy's padrones from his other League affiliations jumped in. Larry was, as usual, really close to the mark.

Anyhow, the get-together ended when I, in speculation, threw out the "What-if" question of the night. What if we get 60 responses? Should we go with three 20-team Leagues or should we put the extra 20 on a waiting list. Both Mike and Larry looked right through me and we broke up for the night.

The 100 letters were sent out on April 1st and we (im)patiently waited for the replies to come rolling in. As stated before, Larry was right, as we filled the 40 slots very quickly. Bob Moore sent in his team name with his acceptance. Mike Bravard called the letter "a historic announcement:" I'm sure that Mike was as surprised as I was with the number of APBA people who joined. We managed to pull in almost the entire membership of the G.T.O. which pretty much sounded the death knell for that well thought of venture.

We got together again in June to tentatively split every one up into some sort of divisional allignment. Geographically, the yet un-named National Divisions and the California group looked to be solid. I had thoughts of playing my entire schedule face-to-face.

The next major get-together we had was at my Aunt's camp at scenic Lake George. New York. My ultimate fantasy for TML is to have a convention up there: As Mike and Larry would tell you, there's a helluva lot of room up there. We had sent a letter to all Managers asking that they indicate their preference in drafting systems. Nite's B.I.G. method won hands down. As witness to the closeness of the 1980 TML races hindsight is golden), the system worked very well. While the four of us (Mike's wife, Teri, was there too) alternated stroking the fire to knock out the night's damp chill, we sorted the entire 1978 card set into the various positions for drafting. We figured that the computer could actually do the entire draft in a matter of seconds, if we could get the repetitious nature of the logic into a computer program. Mike and Teri left to head back to the Capital District early Sunday morning, leaving Larry and I at the Lake. The "Great" Alber and myself played some exhibitions using his B.I.G. team and my RML team. While ingesting some vino, we continued our discussions regarding the League structure. At one point, Larry pulled out a pad and tried to get 20 teams into a 162-game schedule. Well, the wine did him in:

In the early Summer, we had one more get-together at my apartment. At this meeting, we culled all the suggestions that had been made to us for our Constitution and finalized the whole deal. Mike came up with a schedule that was fairly balanced and we all agreed on the idea of our "Summer Stretch." We all felt that the Summer was a time to spend out on the links, with your family, and away from "rolling the bones." We figured that with lumping the Summer schedule together, we would get the results back fairly quick and the 3-game series format allowed Managerial prowess: to extend over only an hour rather than two. We decided, after several failures, to call the TML newsletter, "The Summer Stretch," as it caught the mood fairly well.

As the Summer wore on, Larry and I set out on major missions in life, that of courting and winning our future wives, Debbie and Janet, respectively. Baseball became secondary at best, so Mike pretty much carried the TML load alone. He typed out the finalized TML Constitution, spent long hours with Teri inputting all the names for the draft, inputting the framework of the draft into a workable computer program, as well as double and triple checking everything for correctness. I'm sure that Larry will back me up 100% here, that without Mike's hard work, diligence, and dedication, there would be no TML as you know it:

The initial draft lists were sent out in early August, with a return date of September 12th. I'll not forget the nights before the draft on September 22nd. Hal Schmidt, Larry, Teri, Mike, and I were over at the Landin's sweating up a storm checking over all the draft listsinput for any possible errors in the numbers (remember those? Is Fred Lynn's # 331 or 332?). When the draft of the first 20 players was completed on the afternoon of the 22nd. I was kicking myself over getting the oldest pitching staff in captivity (P.Niekro, Carlton, and Tiant), but was overjoyed in landing personal favorites (Puhl. Templeton, Reitz, and Rodney Scott). The fascination of the beginning of the TML was that each Manager had picked his first 20 by the random draft, had two Free Agent Drafts and a Rookie Draft, along with four months of trading before anyone had played a single game. It was as if the Mariners and the Blue Jays were able to see what kind of year each of their players would have in 1977 before they ever took the field and fell into the pits. The secondary phase of drafting was a Free Agent type draft, held on October 27th, which rounded out each TML team to 30 players. 1980

The Rookie Draft went smoothly, without a hitch. Does anyone remember who went for the most money in the 1980 Rookie Draft? Answer to trivia question: "Young" Dave Yamin spent all \$115,000 on Ross Baumgarten in January (and then unloaded him in September!).

The Free Agent Draft in February looked to be a rowdy affair as Mike Mayko, Jim Schembari, and Mike Moore were coming in from the wilds of Connecticut, Bruce Clark from central New York, and the North Adams connection of Frank, Chris, and the Jer, would be there with all the local contingent. All in all, ii of the 20 National Association Managers were there to make their selections in person. Chris came down looking to hold-up Bruce for Ron Guidry! Larry and I sat together chewing our fingernails as we selected Rene Martin and Odell Jones. I wish Chick Wade could have been there, so I could have called him all the names that I called him, to his face, when he took Jeff Leonard right in front of me! I hope you get here sometime Chick. I owe you! That was the real experience of "Free Agent Day," meeting everyone and seeing them again. There is a great feeling of "family" that pervades a large get-together like that, which makes you forget stupid things like fines, losing, and the Goose getting upper decked by George Brett! (I'm writing this in January of 1981, but the word has it that there

could be as many as 20 raving TML lunatics, including the legendary Art Albanese, present this year at "Free Agent Day." I fully intend to be there and to get Landin so damned drunk on wine that he'll hand me Mike Norris for Dave Edwards!)

I won't go into too much detail on the 1980 TML season, as it will unfold before your eyes in the pages that follow, but I will touch upon some things that made the season a memorable one for me, both as a Manager and as a honcho.

The thing that impressed me about the season was the relative lack of waves. Sure there was a lot of bitching about fines and the like, and the mass exit by the American Association Managers at year's end was certainly unexpected, to say the least! All in all, the season was remarkably tranquil.

This is not to say that we were without troubles. I feel that you should know what the hell goes on behind the scenes up here in the wilds of Cohoes. During the Summer, Larry, Mike, and I had reached decisions that we kept from each other, that pretty much meant that we were going to chuck the League. Like any operation where more than one person is involved in the administration of rules, we had our disagreements. It reached a point in late August that we all, as I have said, were separately going to get out for the best of the League. I could feel something happening and felt it would be best if we all got together over coffee on a Saturday morning, just to clear the air.

"Color" the air would be a better term! All three of us really exploded at one time or another in the course of the 4-hour coffee session! It was very emotional and very cleansing. The end result of that whole thing was that we are all invigorated and hoping that the honesty that we all expressed to each other that day, will always be with us. The TML swept over the last 3 months of the 1980 season in a very relaxed, almost laid back, atmosphere. Indeed, except for the replacing of the American Managers, it operated almost ideally.

I hope that you all realize the bottom line here is to have fun. Sometimes in an endeavor this size, you have to make decisions that will hurt some people. I, speaking for the three of us, just want to re-emphasize that those decisions are never easy, never fun, and fortunately, few and far between. The TML is for you guys. We just run it. If I get a tenth of the pleasure this coming year out of the League that I did last, I will feel it's worth the time.



I look ahead with hopes that I will someday meet the Managers of the American Association in person and get to know them as I've gotten to know all these other guys who, only 5 years ago, were strangers to me.

The TML has been a learning experience for me and what I've learned is that if you don't take yourself seriously and just relax with people, they can teach you that all that really matters is that you enjoy yourself and your friends. Good friends are the bottom line in life and the three of us consider all of you to be good friends!



American '80 - A Review

The American Association races started off calmly in 1980 and grew to where nail biting was even mild, as all four divisions rocketed down the stretch, culminating in the marvelous 3-game showdown between Boulder and Hurricane, which preceded the Playoffs. (Now class, diagram that sentence.)

After the initial drafting phases were completed, it was hard to discern if any team had an advantage going into TML I. The Rookie Draft in 1980 solidified the Boulder position, as Mike Bravard picked up Greg Minton and Joey McLaughlin to shore up his already deep bullpen. Bill James and Dallas Adams had expressed a desire to solidify the L&M franchise with youth and they proved it in snatching Danny Darwin and Dan Quisenberry for the future. "Trader Jack" Stephens gathered some fine material in Rickey Henderson for a mere 11 grand: The highest single American bid was placed by Simi Valley with \$100,000 on Rick Sutcliffe.

With the drafting behind, the 20 American Managers settled down to some wheeling and dealing. Perhaps the deal that had the greatest impact on the eventual outcome of the American Association was the one pulled off by the old cronies from Colorado, as Mike Bravard cut loose Lary Sorensen and Bill Travers to Bob Moore for Dennis Eckersley. That deal was the one, being a long observer of the key Boulder deal, that convinced me that this was going to be another Boulder year.

The season opened with a bang, as Boulder took all eight from its primary competition, the Hurricane Wind. Bob Horner of Virginia Beach had practically a season in the first series, as he launched 11 homeruns in the first 16 games. Dennis Martinez of Virginia Beach came within one pitch of hurling the first TML no-hitter against the Librae, as only a scratch single by Andre Dawson spoiled the show. Bill Lee, the King of Outer Space, also flirted with it in series 3, with only an infield single by Lynn Jones as the blemish.

By Series 4, all the eventual division winners had settled into first place, but their positions were by no means secure. Tim Muledy's Addison Arrows were ripped to shreds at home by Virginia, 20-0, and Berrien Springs' Skipper L.C. Roots must have keeled over when he got back a 26-4 road win from Virginia Beach. L.C.'s troops put together the biggest single run production in the TML for both a game and an inning, when they scored the 26 runs, aided by a 12-run 7th inning, while already holding a 10-1 lead:

Managerial changes soon started showing up around the American. Roy Jensen moved into Jim Reeder's Simi Valley dugout and Glenn Bailey took over the Houston franchise from Dick Adkins. The big news in the American Association was the roaring of the Wind. Hurriacne started to listen with earnest to Mark Smiley and, behind Fergie Jenkins, put together a 35-10 record to move within a single game fo the Livingjas. Jenkins proved to be a major surprise, as he moved his winning streak to epic proportions.

As the Summer Stretch started, San Joaquin Bandido Manager Less Fleming must have felt that his team had finally awaken. He had whipped the Bandidos to within three strides of the top and Frito sales had picked up all around Mill Valley. Virginia Beach was standing just two and a half games behind the Cuyahoga Falls Fungos in the Mays and Addison was just lurking behind Banks leader Chicago.

when the Stretch was over, nothing much had changed. Mather however, seemed to have finally come out of the doldrums that had plagued it throughout the season with a 22-20 Summer Stretch. Hurricane picked up a full three games on Boulder, settling in just one game back, with an overall 25-11 Summer Stretch. The Musial Division looked like it would go right to the wire. Individuals having an outstanding Summer Stretch were Dave Kingman of San Joaquin, who knocked in 48 runs during the 36-game span (while only hitting .270), and Don Baylor of Hurricane, who drove in 30 runs for the Stretch, while scoring 32.

The two Western Conference second place clubs got together at San Joaquin immediately after the finish of the Stretch, and Kingman cut off the Wind with three blasts and dropped the Wind five paces back of Boulder. The Bandidos meanwhile, moved to within two games of the South Salta C's. I had gone public with my predictions in June and the C's were confounding me, being that they were the only team that was currently in the lead that I had not predicted: (Just kidding around, given my past prediction history, I would've been happy with just one correct prediction:)

The Stretch drive began and all the leaders, except Salta, started to roar away from the pack. Ferguson Jenkins won his 17th game in a row for Hurricane, which still hung six games behind Boulder with 32 to go. Mike Landin, in a headline Summer Stretch lead story, gave Chicago a "clinch" with an 11-game lead at the 144-game mark. Little did Mike know that Tim Muledy's Addison Arrows went heavy on the pedal, double-clutched, and blasted the Bruins at Chicago, taking the first seven of the eight game series. And, little did John Gatto know that if the Arrows had snuck by once more, then they would have been dead even and had pulled a 1951 Giant Miracle. It never happened, as the Bruins rolled in, with the help of a 4-4 split at Berrien Springs. Carl Carpenter suffered nearly the same fate, except he was at Simi Valley, needing only one victory to clinch, and he got three. Hurricane continued to run hot and heavy down to the wire and caught Boulder in game #160. The Wind blew in at 25-7 over the last two series and forced the divisional playoff with Boulder.

As you all know by now, Boulder just prevailed in the very last game of the season on an Al Oliver blastoff into the rightfield maniacs in Boulder and the 'Jas just got into the Playoffs. They rolled right through the Playoffs and were crowned the TML Champion:

That was a succinct wrap up of the American season. The powers that be have limited me to two sides to wrap up the story and it isn't enough. I've enjoyed writing about the American goings on this season and look forward to 1981 as another fun filled season.

I volunteered to give up my New York Woodchoppers in the National to move over and take over Stu McCorkindale's Park Ridge team when he left us, but my compadres, Alber, Landin, & Lentine, tole me that I should stick around and let them bash me head in again in TML II. Well, maybe I'll be over to join my American friends eventually.

Thanks for the laughs and friendships. Let's see if I can go 2 for 2 in predicting the American Champion this year.



1980 Season Story

THE ARROWS STARTED OUT GREAT, TAKING THE EARLY LEAD IN THE BANKS DIVISION. A STAGGERING BATTING SLUMP IN MID-SEASON DUG A HOLE THAT A STRONG FINISH COULDN'T OVERCOME. MANY DIS-APPOINTMENTS AT THE PLATE (SIMMONS-.237, WINFIELD-.271, SINGLETON-.261; ALL BELOW EXPECTED .300+ FINISHES) REALLY HURT ADDISION'S PENNANT HOPES. HOWEVER, (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF RICK REUSCHEL'S 5.61 ERA) THE PITCHING WAS VERY GOOD. PHIL NIEKRO (19-13) JUST MISSED A 20-WIN SEASON.
